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#### Background

- Key driver of biodiversity loss
- No comprehensive EU instrument
- Rapidly growing
- Cost of inaction / delayed action

#### Unintentional introductions





- Not wanted in the EU!
- i.e. intentionally brought into, transmitted, permitted to reproduce, transported, used, exchanged, kept, grown or released



- Applies to whole of EU
- ... but not species native to EU
- Limited to 50 species
- Determined by risk analysis (cost / benefit)



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Practitioners point of view:Requirement for data and expertise to support risk analysis



- Must have 'official' surveillance in place
- Duty to detect and report without delay



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Practitioners point of view:Must detect and report



- Must eradicate new detections
  - But derogation is possible
- Otherwise, must manage if already widespread in MS



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Practitioners point of view:
Management will be a requirement
Requires expertise and capacity to deliver responses



- Requirement to restore damaged habitats
  - Member States shall take proportionate restoration measures to assist the recovery of an ecosystem that has been degraded, damaged, or destroyed by invasive alien species of Union concern



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Practitioners point of view:Restoration must be taken into account.



 MS shall ban intentional release into the <u>environment</u> of species that have a significant impact in the territory.



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Practitioners point of view:Little change in the UK?

#### Information support



- To be 'gradually developed' by the Commission
  - Connecting existing national databases
  - Handling notifications
  - Exchanging information



• What it means for practitioners?



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  - For a limited number of species (EU concern):
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    - Increased surveillance and requirements to report
    - Increased efforts to eradicate and manage
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  - Priority pathways ???
